Exodus 1:1-6:1

## A New King in Egypt

Exodus 1:1-8
After deaths of the Patriarchs, the nation declined ... ending in slavery
The Pharaoh that did not know Joseph is further explained by Stephen
Acts 7:18
Not allos (another of the same kind) but heteros (another of a different kind)
Not Egyptian, but perhaps Assyrian??
Isaiah 52:4

## Pharaoh's Agenda \& Tactics

Exodus 1:9-22
Pharaoh's Plan: "deal shrewdly with them..."
Pharaoh's Progressive Plan:

1) Enslave them
2) Abort the babies "The thief comes to steal, to kill and destroy." John 10:10
3) Kill them outright $]$

Pharaoh is the Restrainer \& the Destroyer ... so is Antichrist
II Thess 2:1-8
Implemented policies to keep Israel there so he could use them, then kill them
God's Plan: "...call My Son out of Egypt."
Hosea 11:1 \& Matt 2:15
We know the midwives names -Shiphrah ("Fair") \& Puah ("Splendid") but not Pharaoh's
Egyptian government dictated to "healthcare professionals" who lived \& who died!! When that failed: "Every son who is born you shall cast into the river..."

## The Birth of Moses

Exodus 2:1-10
"beautiful child" 1 I ת כ
"ark" תָּ
Daughter of Pharaoh - probably Thermitus - who was childless
She adopted \& named Moses $\Rightarrow$ making him heir to the throne! Wheat sewn among the Tares!

## Moses Flees to Midian

Exodus 2:11-25
"Who made you a prince and judge over us?" God did!!
The answer to Moses' question: "What did Israel do to deserve this?"
Their attitude! ...same as the Reubenites in Korah's Rebellion
Numbers 16
Thought to be Dathan \& Abiram
Moses was not recognized by his "brothers" - like Joseph... and Yeshua
Matt 23:37-39
God called Moses to Midian
....and he met his bride at a well also
First he interceded for the Hebrew slave \& now Jethro's daughters
Gershom ger ("stranger") + sham ("there")
Moses Meets God at the Burning Bush
Exodus 3:1-12
"Angel of the LORD" in verse 1 ...turns to "LORD \& God" in verse 4
Another "blurring" of the identities of "LORD", "God", and "Angel"
What is it about the burning bush that attracted Moses' attention?
Remove sandals - compare with Joshua
Joshua 5:15
The Pattern in the Burning Bush: Bush (senah) is acacia bush; a thorn bush
Thorns are symbolic of $\qquad$
Fire is symbolic of ... judgment
The Pattern: Sin is judged by God's consuming fire, but the thorns are not consumed. Or, in other words: Sin in the Hands of the Living God is judged, but the life (bush) is not destroyed.

Relationship: "the God of your fathers....
Action: has sent me to you."
God’s Name: יחוה "Yahovah" or "Ya-hoo-ah" Self-Existent \& Eternal One
$\left.\begin{array}{llll}\text { "Ho-veh" } & \text { I was } & \text { (Past Tense) } \\ \text { ה־וֹה "Ha-yeh" } & \text { I am } & \text { (Present Tense) } \\ \text { יחהיה "Yih-yeh" } & \text { I will be } & \text { (Future Tense) }\end{array}\right\}$ Rev 4:8
"This is My Name forever..." olam ען צ צ צ Spelled here without the " $\eta$ " = alem "to conceal"
Therefore, Rabbinic tradition says יהוה is not to be pronounced!
"I have surely visited you and seen what is done to you in Egypt."
Verse 16
Moses' Code Words! (spoken to Joseph in Genesis 50:25)
"I will stretch out my hand and strike Egypt with all My wonders..."
Verse 20
〇 ָָּ palah Key word for the Messiah Judges 13:18 \& Isaiah 9:6

## God Equips Moses

Exodus 4:1-17
Serpent in Moses' hand = Pharaoh's power will become God's tool of deliverance
We have that power also
John 14:12
Succession of Signs: Staff turns into Serpent Leprosy Cleansed Water to Blood (also one of the Plagues)

Separation after $3^{\text {rd }}$ Plague
Did Moses' hand contaminate his heart?? His heart contaminated his hand!

## Moses Returns to Egypt

Exodus 4:18-31
Moses seeks Yitro's permission before leaving for Egypt
God hardened Pharaoh's already hardened heart
God didn't make him wicked (remember Pharaoh's name!)
Hardened hearts in the End Time
Rev 16:9-11 \& II Thess 2:11-12
God's mercy will expire .....
Rev 22:11
God's "deal": Let My Firstborn go... or else I will slay your firstborn
Why did God seek to kill Moses? Because he failed to circumcise his son (failed to keep Torah)
"You are a bridegroom of blood." Spoken to Moses or the son???
"the LORD had visited the children of Israel..." Israel recognized Moses' code words!

## Pharaoh Oppresses Israel

Exodus 5:1-21
Moses' $1^{\text {st }}$ request is to leave and (implied) to come back
This allows God to demonstrate Pharaoh's unreasonableness
"Who is the LORD"? -- The entire world is about to find out who the LORD is!
Moses' requests to release Israel "backfire":
Pharaoh increases the Israelite's quota of work
The Israelites (v15) turn to Pharaoh for relief - wrong move!!
All this was calculated by God to give Moses a "management problem"!

## God's Promise of Deliverance

Exodus 5:22-6:1
Moses: "I haven't done a very good job with Pharaoh."
God: "You have done what I have asked; now watch what I will do!"
Haftarah: Isaiah 27:6-28:13 Israel to be delivered: in the Exodus, from Babylon \& yet to come!
Brit Chadashah: II Thessalonians 2:3-10 Pharaoh is a Pattern of the Anti-Messiah
